





RCO wants you to be informed of new state changes to better the ISP process and services that you receive. ODDS created the Compass Project to improve the way people with intellectual and developmental

disabilities (I/DD) participate in services. There are training and resources for you and more: www.oregon.gov/dhs/Compass-Project/Pages/RC-Individuals.aspx

The goal is to create a system that is easy to use, is transparent and provides quality supports so people with intellectual and developmental disabilities have a good life in the communities where they live, work and play.

The project is committed to providing:

- Information that is easy to find and easy to understand.
- A planning process that is simple and flexible.
- Services and a support plan that are designed with you.

Service groups and new rates:

The Compass Project's first step was creating the Oregon Needs Assessment (ONA). The next step is learning which service group a person has been assigned to. Service groups are based on a person's age and support needs.

Spring Time Recipe—One Pot Pasta with Tomato-Basil Sauce

Ingredient Checklist

- 1. 12 ounces fusilli pasta
- 2. 1 (28-oz.) can diced tomatoes
- 3. 2 cups chicken broth



- 4. ¹/₂ medium-size yellow onion, sliced
- 5. 4 garlic cloves, sliced
- 6. 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 7. $\frac{1}{3}$ cup firmly packed fresh basil leaves
- 8. 2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 9. 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 10. ¹/₄ teaspoon dried crushed red pepper (optional)
- 11. 1 (6-oz.) package baby spinach
- 12. Freshly grated Parmesan cheese

Step 1: Place first 9 ingredients and, if desired, dried crushed red pepper in a pot with a lid or a Dutch oven in order of ingredient list. Cover and bring to a boil over medium-high heat (about 12 to 15 minutes). Reduce heat to medium-low, and cook, covered, 10 to 12 minutes or until pasta is slightly al dente, stirring at 5-minute intervals.

Step 2: Remove from heat, and stir in spinach. Cover and let stand 10 minutes. Stir just before serving. Serve with Parmesan cheese.

Enjoy!

**Note: You can use dried basil if you have that on hand, and top with any white cheese, or make it dairy free by no cheese. Use low sodium broth and whole wheat pasta for a even healthier option. Any pasta of your choice!


Packaged pasta sauce can have a lot of sugar or salt, so make your own to lower your salt and sugar intake!


