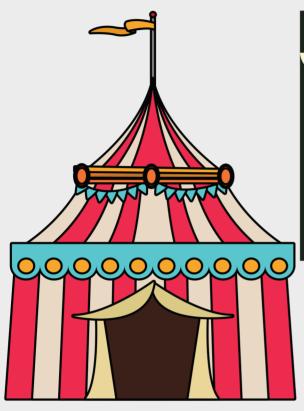

#### RCO Provider Specialists- A Role to Help PSWs and Employers

The Provider Specialist role is still new to RCO and some of you may not even be aware of all that they do! In the past, our Office Team worked with the Personal Agents, who were the main go-to for all PSW related coordination and support. We want to give you the best service and support and we now have a designated Specialist at each brokerage to work with PSW's. You will learn a little about Sandy and Carmen on the next page, but here is a list of some of the tasks that Provider Specialists do.

- Criminal History Background Checks facilitate PSWs through this process.
- FMAS facilitate the setup of new employers and monitor their progress; facilitate the setup of new PSWs and successful linking with employers.
- PSW credentials monitor PSW credentials in both RCO's database and the State's payment and reporting system, communicate with PSWs and follow-up as needed.
- State's payment and reporting system assist Data Specialist with authorizing PSW payments as necessary; identify and correct issues with provider lines; verify paid billing documents have processed through the State's payment system.
- Digital Record Keeping filing of PSW records.
- Assist the Office Team with mass mailings.
- Assist with directing PSWs to state and Union trainings and resources.

## **Resources For You Through Your Health Plan**

Health-Related Services Fund for Things You Need

Sometimes, you have health needs that aren't covered by a health plan or other services. Care Oregon wants to make sure those needs are addressed, too, so you are as healthy as possible. That's why there is a fund for what the Oregon Health Plan (OHP) calls "health-related services." This fund covers items or services that aren't funded by a health plan but will improve a person's health. Steps for requesting funds

- 1. Talk to your provider or care coordinator about what's keeping you from getting and staying healthy. Members of your care team can make requests for health-related services funds.
- 2. If your diagnosis or treatment calls for an item or service not otherwise included in your health coverage, they'll fill out a form on our website to make the request.
- 3. We'll let you and the person who made the request know if your request is approved.

Examples include:

 Phone/video appointments: A cell phone, tablet, or internet for access to providers



 Food support: Meal delivery, food vouchers, farmers market funds



 Housing support: Furniture, application fees for housing or a state-issued ID, moving costs



• Living environment: Air conditioners, athletic shoes, items that improve mobility



 Comfort items: Weighted blankets, sleep aids, vouchers for yoga classes



Any health care provider can make a request for you. They will need to describe how the item or service requested fits into your treatment plan.

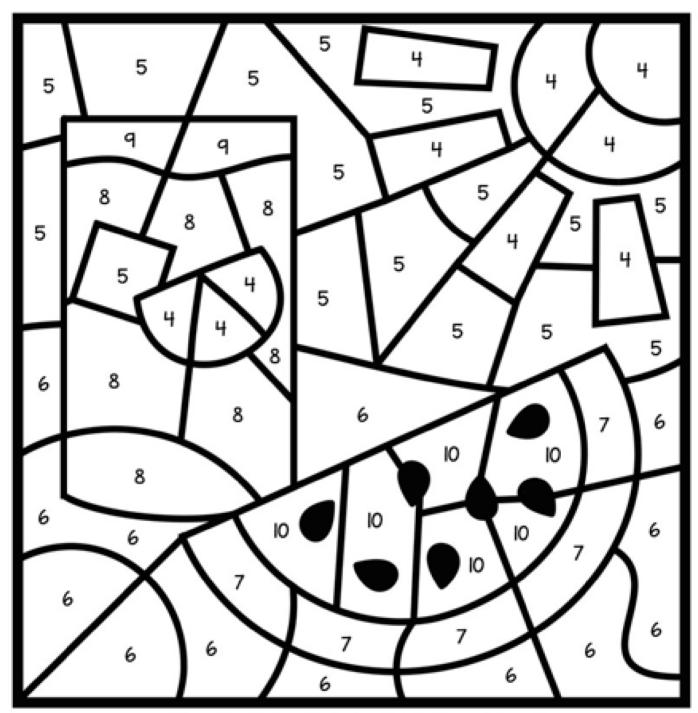
